Established by Madame Kira Bousloff in 1952, West Australian Ballet is the first ballet company formed in Australia still in existence today.

Since its formation West Australian Ballet has developed an impressive reputation for a strong balance of classical and contemporary repertoire and delivered performances at the highest level. Its repertoire continues to develop steadily; classical ballet forming the foundation for the Company's vocabulary, reflecting a unique West Australian perspective. This is done through presenting heritage and commissioned full length narrative classical ballets and shorter works, that encompass a variety of choreographic styles.

The Company is based in Perth and resides at the West Australian Ballet Centre in Maylands. It offers an extensive program of dance throughout the year, with four to five major seasons in Perth, regional touring throughout Western Australia, choreographic workshops, an extensive education program and other community activities. West Australian Ballet tours nationally and internationally; and enjoys an artistic partnership with the West Australian Symphony Orchestra.

West Australian Ballet pays tribute to the traditional custodians of the land upon with we live and dance, the Whadjuk people of the Noongar Nation, and our respects to culture and Elders past and present.

The AD sets the artistic vision for WAB through staging works from the Ballet canon and commissioning inspiring new works. The AD manages and selects the dancers of the company and the artistic staff, has oversight of the Performance health team to ensure the best physical and wellness outcomes for the company's artists. They are a member of the Senior Leadership Team and liaise across departments. The AD is the public face of the company and upholds the artistic reputation for the organisation, engaging with all the various stakeholders from private, corporate and government areas.



THE ROLE

The West Australian Ballet Artistic Director is responsible for the artistic leadership of the organisation. They work with the Board and alongside the Executive Director to develop the Company's shared vision and values.

The Artistic Director has primary responsibility to implement the artistic vision through the commissioning, planning and selection of quality repertoire which offers a program of diverse and high-quality offerings to Western Australian audiences. They work for the continuous development of the Company's dancers technical and artistic quality to ensure the Company's ongoing success and high reputation.

This is a full-time role, based at the West Australian Ballet Centre in Perth, Western Australia, for an initial contract period of three (3) years. Applications are welcome from Australian and International candidates. International candidates must be able to prove eligibility to obtain an Australian Working Visa.

Salary and other conditions will be negotiated with the successful candidate.



KEY RESPONSIBILITIES

- Develop an artistic vision and goals for the Company in consultation with the Executive Director, leadership team, Board and other relevant stakeholders in line with the Mission, Vision and Strategic Plan.
- Lead the commissioning, programming and appointment of creative teams for all West Australian Ballet productions and projects and deliver productions and projects within the agreed budgets.
- Ensure that repertoire and program contribute to, support, and build on the Company's brand and reputation and reflect the Company's Vision, creating accessible and varied opportunities for people to engage with dance.

- Effectively lead and manage the artistic staff, visiting creatives, and dancers so that high levels of morale, professional standards, and creativity are maintained.
- Identify and develop artists, and creative collaborations, across the sector to enable the nurturing of talent and the telling of stories that reflect our unique West Australian identity.
- Be an internal and external advocate for the Education and Community Engagement department and contribute to the development of appropriate education / access programs in consultation with the Head of Education and Community Engagement.
- Play a key advocacy role for the Company and the art form with major stakeholders, and the broader dance and arts community.

- A recognised and respected member of the ballet world with extensive knowledge of current ballet and dance practices.
- A reputation for artistic quality as an Artistic Director, choreographer, rehearsal director, or dancer.
- An extensive network of respectful and positive relationships with national and international creatives, and cultural leaders in ballet and the arts community.
- An understanding of West Australian Ballet's history, and interest in building a dynamic future based on its success and reputation.
- An empathetic leader, who builds high performing teams and develops potential in artists.
