## Public Access to West Australian Ballet Centre (WABC) – Phase 3

West Australian Ballet have implemented measures to ensure the safety of staff and patrons, in preparation for a public to return to WABC.

### **These measures are currently in place and operations will increase if required:**

- Hand sanitiser distributed throughout building, especially at doors and bathrooms;
- Cleaning and disinfecting public areas before and after performances;
- Physical distancing measures are followed, which included seating arrangements for audience;
- Disinfect public areas every day.

### **Further measures for Adult Ballet Classes participants include:**

- Temperature checks of participants on arrival (managed by Teaching Artist at the Studio Four entrance only);
- Your class booking details will be used for Contact Tracing measures should a case become present at WABC;
- Masks for participants to wear, if they wish;
- Open doors for participants (so they don't need to touch any surfaces);
- No cash payments accepted on the premises;
- Tape-guides which demonstrate physical distancing, especially in congestion areas, and signage to discourage mingling;
- Participants are encouraged to bring a full water bottle to class and where possible, be dressed and ready for class;
- Participants will only have access to the studio 15 mins prior to class commencing and must leave immediately once class concludes.

### **The following social distancing guidelines continue to apply:**

- Stay home if you're sick. Do not come to class;
- Keep 1.5 metres away from others;
- Don't make unnecessary physical contact with others. Avoid physical greetings, such as handshakes, hugs and kisses;
- Wash your hands regularly for at least 20 seconds with soap and water and/or alcohol-based sanitiser;
- Cover your mouth and nose when you cough or sneeze. Use a flexed elbow or a tissue; if you use a tissue, dispose of it immediately and appropriately.
